About our research

Our national project is independent, funded by the Economic and Social Research Council and involves researchers from six universities. The research looks at welfare sanctions and support for service users (including jobseekers, disabled people, homeless people, ex-offenders) and how these may change behaviour.

We want to gain a range of perspectives on welfare conditionality. We have already carried out 44 interviews with policy makers and 480 interviews with service users in 10 cities across England and Scotland. We plan follow up interviews with service users over the next two years. In addition we are facilitating 24 focus groups with frontline practitioners and advisors.

We want your views on welfare conditionality and lone parents.
