Conditionality



imposes **Control** and requires compliance it's a panopticon of **Oversight**

builds a **Narrative of shame**

has a **Disproportionate impact** on disabled people

the so called **Incentives are disincentives**

uses **Threat** of sanctions as punishment

lack of **Income** leads to multiple cluster problems

Online journal is a means of control

Negative enforcement, not positive rights

Antithesis of positive behaviour change

they say it is **Like work** but it is without the protections that workers get

it is **Ineffective** at helping people get in, stay in & get on at work

it **Triggers** and escalates a spiral of negative outcomes


emphasis on do-it-Yourself work searching and support


Conditionality



A General Idea of a PENITENTIARY PANOPTICON in an Improved, but as yet (San 1995 1991). Unfinished State.


